General Information

Fuzzy Systems & A.I. - Reports & Letters is a publication of the Romanian Academy. The journal is intended to provide a fast communication mean for fully refereed papers, mainly covering the areas commonly shared by Fuzzy Systems and Artificial Intelligence. The main topics are: fuzzy sets and systems theory and its application, neural networks, approximate reasoning, decision theory and optimization, intelligent control.

Two classes of contribution are basically envisaged: letters, i.e. short papers, up to four pages long, and reports, i.e., survey papers, up to twenty-five printed pages long. Also featured are: technical notes, brief descriptions of applied ideas, book and software review, research and conference accounts a.s.o. Thus, the journal complements, rather competes, other publications in the field.

Notes for Contributors

Authors of papers within the scope of the journal should submit five copies of their articles to the Managing Editor. The manuscript should be written in English and typed on one side of paper in double spacing, with wide margins and using Times New Roman font (11 pt).

Titles should be relevant and as short as possible.

Authors' names and affiliations must appear below the title.

An abstract of a reasonable length (120 words) must precede the article.

Chapters should be labeled with Arabic numerals such as:

1. Introduction. 2. P-fuzzy relations. 2.1. Crisp case, etc.

Equations can be labeled on the extreme right of the page by Arabic numerals enclosed in parentheses. Special symbols should be identified and typing explanations given in the margin of the manuscript.

Figures referred to in the text should be clearly drawn on China drawing paper and clearly lettered in view of the final dimension that the author prefers. A short explanatory figure caption must be given on a separate sheet of paper.

Tables must have titles.

References will be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals enclosed in square brackets (e.g. [13]) and listed on a separate sheet of paper as follows:

Authors are encouraged to send the manuscript on a 3.5 inch diskette, to help editorial processing; this would be especially helpful if pictures are included. The text can be processed in Microsoft Word any version beginning with 6.

Once accepted, the papers are normally published in first issue going to press.

Authors are invited to provide complete address, including phone number, fax, e-mail, etc.

Refereeing Procedure

Papers are accepted either based on the opinion of at least three independent referees, or based on the recommendation of a Guest Editor who takes the charge to discuss the paper with his coworkers. The second way the papers are accepted for publication is used if a specific laboratory is, at that moment of time, the only one where researchers were previously completed on the subject the paper deals with. However, the decision on the way the paper is refereed remains with the Editors.

Reprints and Page Charges

Twenty reprints of each article published will be supplied free of charge to the first named author. Orders for additional reprints must be placed with the Editorial Office when submitting the final manuscript for production.
